Right now, we are facing unprecedented challenges as a community and as a non-profit caring for one of the most vulnerable populations - abused children

As a result of the current pandemic situation, families may be feeling isolated, financially stressed due to jobs closing or cut hours, and many parents are facing the challenge of closed daycare and schools.

The possibility of increased abuse and/or neglect is very real for children in our community.

3.6 Million cases of reported abuse annually.

5 children per day die from abuse and neglect.

1 out of 3 girls and 1 out of 5 boys will be sexually abused
