SafeCare is an evidence-based training program for parents who are at-risk or have been reported for child abuse and neglect. SafeCare services are targeted to families that have one or more risk factors, including families with substance abuse or domestic violence issues, teenage parents, parents of special needs children, single parents, and low-income families through at-home parent education and training. The goal of the SafeCare Program is to ensure that the children's safety and health are a priority and the parent-child interactions are appropriate and reduce the stress and challenges for both of them. During the Covid-19 Pandemic, SafeCare has been providing services to meet the needs of our families through TeleHealth to ensure the safety of everyone involved. The program is a boration between Hibiscus and Bel navior B Inc. and serves St. Lucie and Indian River Counties.

Families in

Crisis is a voluntary prevention program provided by Hibiscus Children's Center to assist families in St. Lucie County. The Supporting Families in Crisis Program (SFC) addresses whatever crisis a may be experiencing that if not addressed, cause their children to be removed by the State. During the Covid-19 Pandemic, SFC has been continually helping families through these challenging times and utilizes TeleHealth to ensure the safety of everyone involved. SFC has a 100% success rate in keeping children out of the child welfare system during and one-year after services.

ecently, SFC provided a much-needed car to a former resident of Hibiscus Children's Shelter "Hibiscus changed my life and helped me become the woman and mom I am today" This car was donated by a generous local supporter.

Parents As Teachers Program

Parents As Teachers is a parent education home-visiting program. The goal of the program is to provide parents with child development knowledge and parenting support, provide early detection of developmental delays and health issues, prevent child abuse and neglect, and increase children's school readiness. This community program provides services to children and families in Okeechobee County and has also utilized TeleHealth during the Covid-19 Pandemic.

Florida's Children

This is a snapshot of the average weekly cases of child maltreatment reported during the month of May, 2020 from the Florida Abuse Hotline:

- 1,140 cases of inadequate supervision of children
- 927 cases of household violence threatening children.
- 709 cases of physical injury.
- 230 cases of sexual abuse / molestation

Although these numbers reflect a decrease in the abuse cases reported to the Hotline during the Covid-19 Pandemic, they are extremely disturbing. Children are not being seen by teachers, coaches, neighbors, grandparents and even, pediatricians. Even though reports are down, social isolation and the stress and financial burdens that families are experiencing causes great concern for the welfare of children

Hibiscus Children's Center has been part of the solution to prevent child abuse and help children recover from the trauma of abuse for <u>35 years</u>.

- Abuse prevention services are provided to almost 1,000 children & families annually through the SafeCare and SFC Programs
- 375,000 nights of safety and over 3,000 children & youth have received life-changing services since 1985. Over 200 children served annually in our residential programs, Tilton Family Children's Shelter and Hibiscus Village. Specialized Sexual Abuse Treatment for children affected by sexual abuse and human trafficking. Trauma-informed care for all children in our care. Professional Mental Health services to over 850 children annually.
