- 90 children received safe haven.
- 94% identified post-graduation opportunities.
- 89% improved their school attendance by decreasing number of absences and/or tardiness.
- 100% of youth improved career related skills.

SANCTUARY MODEL

The Sanctuary Model is an innovative, evidence-based trauma-informed organizational change model. It addresses the health and well-being of children in our care and our staff and volunteers. All Hibiscus staff have been trained in the Sanctuary Model and the agency received recertification in 2023.

HIBISCUS CHILDREN'S VILLAGE

THE VILLAGE

The Village is a 40-bed group home facility that opened its doors in May, 2004 to provide a safe haven for abused youth. The Village consists of a campus center, outdoor activity/basketball area and eight homes – 6 residences, a Career Pathways Center featuring Graphic Design & Culinary components, and an Academic Achievement Center.

YOUTH

Youth, ages 12 to 17, are removed from their homes due to abuse, neglect and/or abandonment by the State. Youth are placed at the Village for a few days, months, or sometimes, even years. Many youth will "age out of the system" at 18.

STAFF & VOLUNTEERS

Teens are cared for by a group of caring and trauma-trained staff. The staff provide a home-like environment including chores and curfews. Volunteers enhance care by helping with homework, activities and more.

MEDICAL/DENTAL SERVICES

Within 72 hours of arriving at the Village, youth receive a medical assessment and the appropriate services. A nurse is located at the Village to care for teen's daily medical needs. Teens also receive dental services in the community.

CAREER PATHWAYS TO INDEPENDENCE PROGRAM

Youth participate in life skill development and career preparation training. Youth are engaged in community based internships with local businesses and agencies, as well as on-site internships.

GRAPHIC DESIGN IMPACT CENTER (GDIC) & CULINARY

Components of the Career Pathways Program, both are designed to teach youth marketable and life skills that will help to provide a successful transition to adulthood and enhance competitive employment opportunities. Activities are designed to reinforce critical thinking, problem solving, build self-esteem, and identify continuing education options to support the skills needed to attain internships and employment.

GDIC is led by a professional staff member with graphic design expertise. The goal is to help youth prepare for more advanced technical and "white collar" jobs in graphic design, print and distribution.

The C.U.L.I.N.A.R.Y. component (Cooking Up Life skills, Intellect, and Nutrition for Ambitious & Resilient Youth) provides culinary education and training to gain food handling and service certifications.



MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Professional therapists provide on-site services to teens, specializing in the treatment of trauma-based disorders, behavioral health, and healing victims of sexual abuse. Services are provided by master-licensed therapists who have been professionally trained and have a true passion for working with youth. Teens also receive psychiatric services such as medication management in conjunction with our counseling services to ensure the best outcomes.

EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

Youth attend public schools and are encouraged to be part of extracurricular activities. The Education Coordinator is the liaison with the school system. Youth are strongly encouraged to obtain their high school or GED diploma. Volunteers assist with after-school homework and tutoring.
